This term we also have our Alternative Sports Day coming up on 14^{th} June and our more traditional Sports Day (to which you are invited) on the afternoon of 21^{st} June. More information will follow on this so you know what to expect.

Bikes, scooters and buggies

It is great that, with the weather being fair, children are coming to school on their bikes and scooters. Please could we remind you to park scooters and bikes in the bike racks as thoughtfully as possible so we can get them all in. Also, please could you remember to give your child a helmet to wear when riding in order to keep them safe. When our Year 5 children did Bikeability this year, they were told the importance of wearing a helmet.

Could we also request that buggies are not left in the bike racks. If your child needs a buggy to come to school, please take it with you after you have left them here. This will free up space for the bikes and scooters. The buggies also often get damp while they are sat here, which must be unpleasant for the child when they get in at the end of the day.

Finally, do keep reminding your children **not to ride their bike or scooter while they are on school property**. They must walk along with it, taking care not to knock into other pedestrians.

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School dinners

Please can we remind you that school dinners need to be paid for <u>in advance</u> of being ordered. The kitchen will be able to supply one lunch without credit but otherwise, if your account is in debt, you will need to send your child into school with a packed lunch.

Please ensure that your account is not in any debt for the school holidays. Parents may be phoned to ask them to bring in a packed lunch if the credit on the account does not cover the dinners for the last week of term.

The kitchen manager is not allowed to give dinners without credit and the office staff are having to spend too much time chasing parents to pay. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Holiday during term-time

Please remember that holidays during term-time should not be taken. Children need to be in school every school day unless they are particularly unwell or have an appointment which cannot be rescheduled. Central Bedfordshire Attendance Officers keep a close check on schools and require school to inform them when parents have taken children out of school for holidays.
